# BIOGRAPHY

Carol Sawyer is a singer and visual artist working primarily with photography, installation, video, and improvised music. Since the early 1990's her work has been concerned with the connections between photography and fiction, performance, memory, and history. She has exhibited widely in both solo and group shows across Canada and in the U.S., and been the recipient of numerous Canada Council and BC Arts Council grants. Her work is in the collections of the Canada Council Art Bank, Microsoft Corporation, and the Museum of Fine Arts in Houston Texas among others. She has completed three photo-based projects and one video installation for the City of Vancouver Public Art Program, the most recent of which is a series of seven short videos that played on large public screens at Robson and Granville as part of the city's 125<sup>th</sup> anniversary celebrations. She has designed and taught courses in interdisciplinary studio, photography, and the social history of photography at ECIAD and SFU. Sawyer lives and works in Vancouver, B.C. She performs regularly with her improvising ensemble ion Zoo (with whom she has released two CDs) and in other ad hoc improvising ensembles. Her work is represented by Republic Gallery, Vancouver.
